The General Assembly,

- 1 HAVING ADOPTED the Millennium Declaration and the Universal
- 2 Declaration of Human Rights, as well as the Plan of Action of the World
- 3 Summit for Social Development,
- 4
- 5 GUIDED BY the Convention on the Elimination of Discrimination
- 6 Against Women, the Convention on the Elimination of Racial
- 7 Discrimination, and the Millennium Development Goals,
- 8
- 9 NOTING WITH REGRET the high incidence of racial, ethnic, and
- 10 religious conflict in many parts of the world, and the negative
- 11 consequences resulting thereafter,
- 12
- 13 AWARE of the work of the United Nations' Children's Fund (UNICEF) in
- 14 promoting education and the importance of education in promoting
- 15 gender equality, social tolerance, and social integration,
- 16
- 17 PROMOTING the availability and accessibility of education for all,
- 18
- 19 KEEPING IN MIND the growing population of the world's refugees and
- 20 their difficulty in obtaining basic human needs in the area of social
- 21 development,
- 22
- 23 NOTING the success of scholarship transfer programmes, which bring
- 24 disadvantaged students, especially refugees, to host Member States to
- 25 gain an advanced education to further benefit their native countries
- 26 upon repatriation,
- 27
- 28 DEEPLY CONCERNED by the almost one million victims of human
- 29 trafficking per year and the continued exploitation of women and
- 30 children throughout the world,
- 31

32 GUIDED BY the Declaration on the Survival, Protection, and
33 Development of Children and its Plan of Action and the Convention on
34 Transnational Organized Crime's Protocol to Prevent, Suppress, and
35 Punish Trafficking in Persons, Especially Women and Children,

37 TAKING INTO ACCOUNT the need for reconstruction of basic
38 infrastructure destroyed due to conflict and natural disasters,

- 39 1. ENCOURAGES the adoption of the Declaration on the Promotion
40 Among Youth of the Ideals of Peace, Mutual Respect, and
41 Understanding Among Peoples, which promotes the principles of
42 tolerance and respect in education;
43
- 44 2. RECOMMENDS the further support of programmes promoting the
45 education of girls and the construction of schools for all education
46 levels through programmes such as the UN Girl's Education Initiative,
47 UNICEF's Child Friendly Schools, which promotes gender equality, and
48 UNICEF's Schools for Africa;

- 50 3. SUGGESTS that Member States provide free compulsory education for
51 children and youth and that Member States reduce or eliminate
52 barriers to education through the provision of supply kits by
53 programmes such as UNICEF's Kits for Kids Initiative;

- 55 4. SEEKS renewed commitment to the Millennium Development Goal of
56 universal primary education (MDG #2) through increased donations of
57 willing and able Member States towards UN Programmes directed
58 towards education;

- 60 5. REQUESTS the increased assistance of the United Nations High
61 Commission on Refugees in implementing educational programmes
62 specifically targeted towards refugees and Internally Displaced
63 Persons;

- 65 6. ENCOURAGES the use of scholarship transfer programmes for
66 vulnerable groups, especially refugees, to enhance their education and
67 training in order for them to contribute to development in their
68 countries of refuge;

- 70 7. FURTHER INVITES the increased participation of women in post-
71 conflict and post-disaster reconstruction in order to implement the
72 principles of the Conference on Women in Post-War Reconstruction;

- 74 8. FURTHER ENCOURAGES regional organizations to adopt positions and
75 programmes of implementation modeled after the African Common
76 Position on Social Integration which seeks to integrate all members of
77 society, to provide adequate skills for employment, and to provide
78 social protection for all members of society;

- 80 9. FURTHER REQUESTS increased support to the programmes of regional
81 organizations such as the African Union, the Commonwealth of
82 Independent States, and the Arab League for reconstruction and
83 revitalization after conflict and natural disaster;

- 85 10.URGES the General Assembly to declare 2010 as the International Year
86 of Social Tolerance and Awareness, with participating nations of the
87 World Cup, which is to be held in South Africa, taking strides to
88 promote the ideals of tolerance and equality;

- 90 11.SUGGESTS that Member States implement regional and community
91 programmes which raise awareness of ethnic, cultural, and religious
92 values and other informational community programmes to promote
93 the equal inclusion of women and minorities in education and society,
94 and equality in social justice;

- 96 12.URGES Member States and regional organizations to increase efforts
97 towards combating human trafficking, raising awareness of the causes
98 and consequences of trafficking, and increasing the effectiveness of
99 border control through increased cooperation with Interpol, national
100 police, and organizations dealing with trafficking and to use the
101 policies and programmes of the United Nations Office of Drugs and
102 Crime.
