ECOSOC PLENARY**

- 1 REAFFIRMING the United Nations’ commitment to sustaining the environment in  
2 regard to clean energy practices,  
3  
4 RECOGNIZING that there is an immense amount of waste occurring during the  
5 transmitting and transporting of various forms of energy due to insufficient resource  
6 management,  
7  
8 ALARMED BY the exponential increase in carbon dioxide emissions over the last fifteen  
9 years,  
10  
11 AFFIRMING AND SUPPORTING the principles upheld in pivotal environmental  
12 agreements such as the Kyoto Protocol, REED Initiative, Johannesburg Declaration and  
13 the GNESD Report,  
14  
15 REAFFIRMING the importance of the Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency  
16 Partnership effort in developing and promoting the use of renewable energy,  
17  
18 GUIDED BY the success of the Indian Solar Finance Initiative, which works to provide  
19 greater access to sources of solar energy,  
20  
21 BEARING IN MIND that successful environmental practices will be manifested in both  
22 micro and macro environmental management,  
23  
24 1. ENCOURAGES more efficient and environmentally friendly international  
25 business practices;  
26  
27 2. RECOGNIZES international environment policy and pushes for the  
28 evaluation and improvement of this policy, as well as economic repercussions,  
29 including but not limited to, heavy fines to be distributed to the country in  
30 question for environmental improvement for businesses who do not uphold  
31 said agreements and to focus on the enforcement of this improved policy;

33 3. REQUESTS increasing education to reduce energy consumption, especially in  
34 the developing world;

36 4. CALLS FOR the implementation of a global energy building code for new  
37 commercial and public construction;
